- Updated oral health provider list.

- Expanded staffing to strengthen program evaluation and quality assurance of school-based dental care.
- Strengthened oral health training & education:
 - Published training module on fluoride varnish for medical providers in school settings to educate all providers on current best practices. Training can be found on DOHMH's Oral Health webpage:

- Expansion of outreach
 - Introduced new school-based dental providers and expanded direct dental service programs in school settings. Expanded from approximately 480 schools in 2017-2018 SY to 664 at the start of the 2018-2019 SY.
 - Purchased portable equipment and dental materials for school-based dental providers, to strengthen provision of their services.
 - Strengthened program evaluation of direct service programs through increased qualitative and quantitative assessments.
 - Developed a standardized evaluation method in partnership with the New York State Department of Health Dental Program. The established tool is in use across all NYC's school-based dental providers (n=17).
