New in the Preliminary Budget



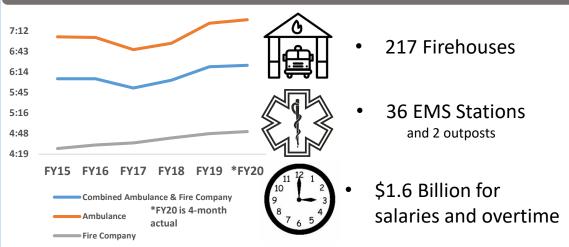
New Needs. The Fiscal 2021 Preliminary Budget introduces **\$2.5 million** in New Needs for Fiscal 2021 to support 37 new positions.

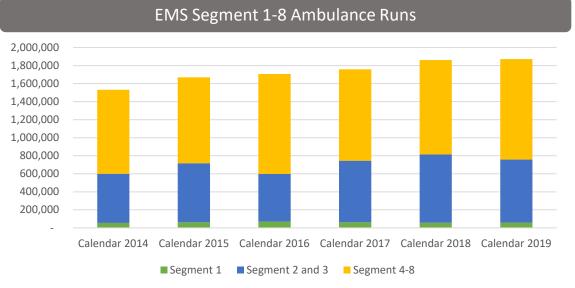
Highlights include **\$1.1 million** for 16 Fire Inspectors and Trainers, the addition of ten personnel for Criminal Justice Reform, seven new positions for Fire Prevention, and four EMS employees to support the new Health Engagement and Assessment Team.



Capital Changes. The Fiscal 2020 Preliminary Capital Commitment Plan for Fiscal 2020-2024 shows an approximately \$50 million shift in projects from Fiscal 2020 and 2021 to Fiscal 2022 and 2023.
