As of 9/11/23, the City has spent an average of \$387 per household per night for asylum seekers, using cost data through 7/31/23. The City calculates per diem rates on a lag due to agency revisions to recent cost estimates. This aggregate average per diem rate per household covers shelter, security and food for all asylum seekers in the City's care.
