

#### Fiscal Year 2022

- Department of Sanitation: \$180,000 (extra litter pick up and basket service)
- Wildcat Service Corporation: \$100,000 (neighborhood cleaning and beautification, graffiti removal, free shoveling service for seniors and the disabled)
- NYC H2O: \$20,000 (Community clean ups and environmental education for youth and adults)

#### Fiscal Year 2023

- Department of Sanitation: \$130,000 (extra litter pick up and basket service)
- Department of Sanitation: \$30,000 (Sanitation enforcement cameras for District 12)
- Wildcat Service Corporation: \$120,000 (Neighborhood cleaning and beautification, graffiti removal, free shoveling service for seniors and the disabled)
- NYC H2O: \$20,000 (Community Clean-ups and environmental education for youth and adults)

#### Fiscal Year 2024

- Department of Sanitation: \$160,000 (extra litter pick up and basket service)
- Association of Community Employment: \$80,000 (Community cleaning and beautification)
- Center for Employment Opportunities: \$20,000 (Community cleaning and beautification, free shoveling for seniors and the disabled)
- NYC H2O: \$20,000 (Community Clean-ups and environmental education for youth and adults)









### LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

#### **Promoting Sanitation Through Law**

Council Member Riley has drafted and supported a number of bills regarding sanitation, including many related to city cleaning operations, waste disposal, recycling efforts, dumping enforcement, violation notices, neglected properties, outdoor dining and much more.

For example, on December 7th 2022 Council Member Riley introduced Intro 850-2022, a bill to assign jurisdiction to city agencies including the Department of Sanitation, the Department of Transportation and the Department of Parks and Recreation for the cleaning and maintenance of certain city properties.


Council Member Riley has introduced <u>1 new bill</u> and co-sponsored <u>27 bills</u> related to sanitation which have been heard in several Committees. These bills aim to strengthen the operations of New York City's Sanitation Department and its systems with <u>solutions</u> to relevant public issues.



Of those 28 bills, 8 have already successfully been passed by Council Members via a full vote.

### LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

#### 28 Sanitation Bills Supported By CM Riley



- Examples -

#### Intro 1217-2023:

A Local Law to to require the Department of Sanitation to develop a plan for promoting the proper disposal of rechargeable batteries used for powered mobility devices, such as motorized bicycles and scooters.

Int 145-2022/ Local Law 2024/818

A Local Law requiring the
Department of Sanitation to
remove fallen tree limbs,
branches, and vegetation that
obstruct streets and sidewalks
as a result of severe weather.

#### WE ARE CALLING ON ALBANY TO END THE MEDICAID FUNDING CRISIS NOW!

All New Yorkers deserve equal access to quality healthcare, no matter their income or which community they live in. Yet today in New York, Medicaid pays hospitals 30% less than the actual cost of care for treating low-income seniors, people with disabilities, and children from low-income families.

The Medicaid funding crisis is already at New York's door, but there is a commonsense solution: New York's leaders must increase Medicaid reimbursements to cover the full cost of care, so that all New Yorkers have access to quality care.

#### **CURRENT STATE OF HEALTHCARE**

- New York faces a growing mental health crisis, while hospitals have lost 850 mental health beds in recent years.
- Low-income women are more likely than other women to have potential lifethreatening complications during or after childbirth.
- Half of New York hospitals have reported reducing and/or eliminating services due to staffing shortages and the shortage is project to get worse.

#### FAILURE TO FULLY FUND MEDICAID IS NOT AN OPTION WHAT FULLY FUNDED MEDICAID MEANS

- Hospitals can provide the mental health services people need.
- Ensure that all mother and babies receive care they need.
- · Hospitals can hire staff to provide quality care.
