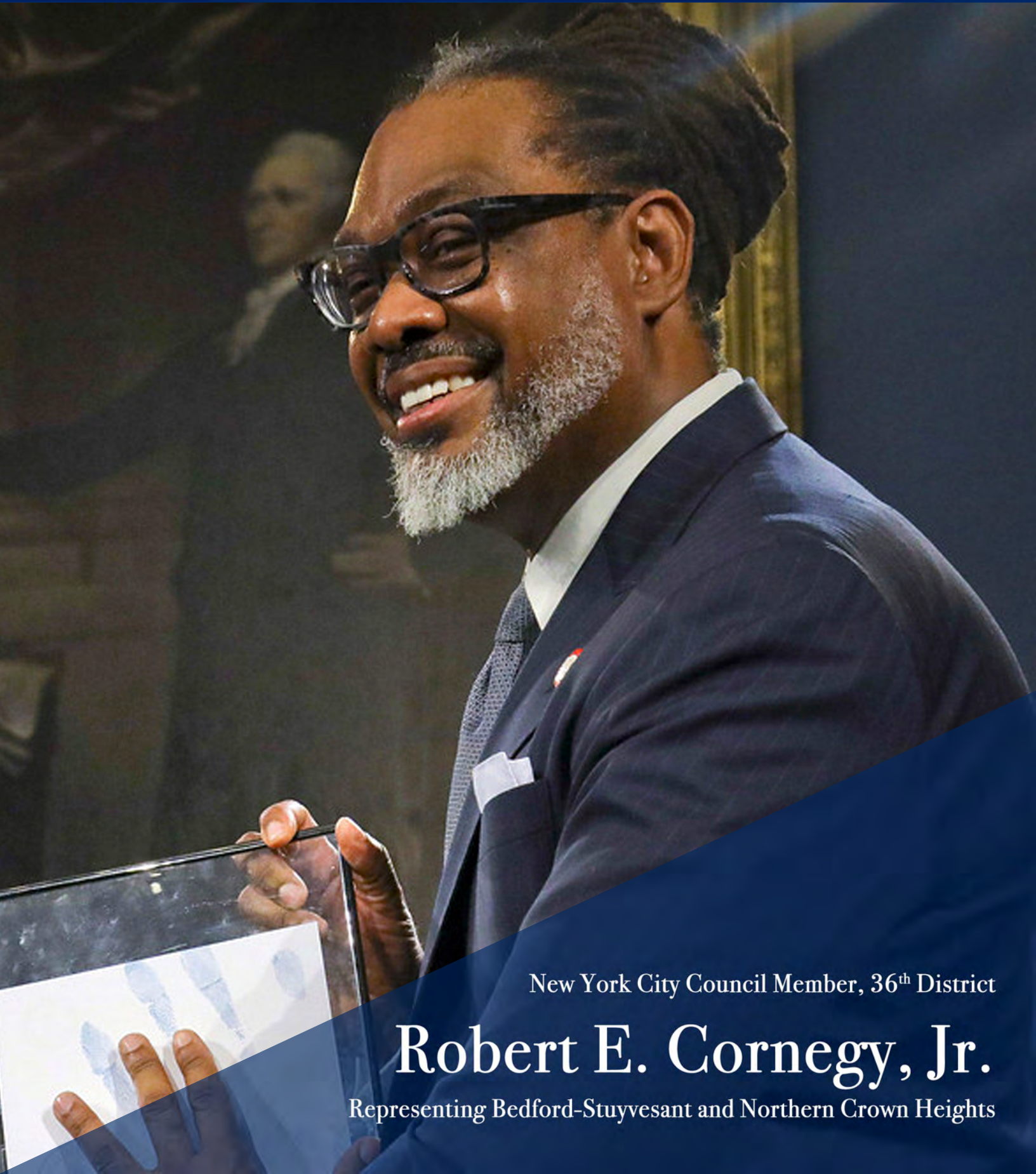

Do you have the tools you need to create your own narrative? I believe the answer is yes. We have such a wide variety of organizations and individuals here in Brooklyn that can help you overcome every challenge, to rise to your greatest potential.

This resource guide is the result of faith in our community. It is the product of my desire to help you accomplish your goals, whether that be running a successful business, being a caring grandparent or finding support for mental health challenges.

Because of term limits, **December 31, 2021 marks my last day in the City Council after eight years representing our community. I cherish the time I have been able to count you as a partner in this sacred duty.** While many know that I played basketball internationally before I was elected to the City Council, fewer know that I then served as an Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor and opened a successful residential treatment center. This experience is why I created a City Council office with a unique staff—I hired both a licensed social worker and an Ambassador of Arts and Culture.

I worked to create programs that would last beyond my time in office. Initiatives I established in our district have spread across New York City, most notably our D36 **Naturally Occurring Retirement Community (NORC)** and **Chamber On The Go**, which now brings resources directly into small businesses in neighborhoods across the City.

It has been an honor to serve District 36 Bedford-Stuyvesant and Northern Crown Heights. During my first term, I had the awesome responsibility of serving as Chair of the Committee on Small Business. In my second term, I served as Chair of Housing and Buildings Committee; of the Commission on Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprises; and of the Democratic Conference.

What you will find in here: **This guide is divided into subjects focused on your needs.**

- The first section provides information about the leading **Arts and Cultural Organizations** in our district.
- Our neighborhood has a wealth of resources to help small businesses face a wide variety of challenges. For generations, the Bedford Stuyvesant and Crown Heights communities

have built institutional support for people working to keep wealth in the neighborhood. The **Business Resource Guide** is designed to be a useful document that will open a door to a variety of support for your business.

- To say that violence spreads like a disease is not a metaphor—it is what the science now shows. We have highly effective and time-tested public health methods used worldwide to stop the spread of contagious diseases. The **Cure Violence Resource Guide** is based on current best practices. Our neighborhood has been a leader in self-empowerment for many decades, and we want to reconnect our community to resources not only to prevent violence but to thrive.
- Our houses of worship play a vital role in our community. They inform, they educate, and they nourish our spiritual life. The **Ecumenical Resource Guide** serves as a starting point in connecting residents with these important pillars of our community.
- We have the most dynamic and creative seniors anywhere—or Seenagers, as I prefer to call them. If you are a senior, grandparenting caregiver or relative with a senior in your life, it is my hope that this **Grandparents and Seniors Guide** will become a great resource for you.
- Our shared community benefits from the work of countless organizations, individuals, and community-minded institutions who uplift our collective well-being. This **LGBTQ+ Resource Guide** serves as one tool to help the LGBTQ+ community and allies connect with resources to meet real needs, like access to health care, legal services, scholarship opportunities, and more.
- We all have a role to play in improving access to mental health services. Our **Mental Health Resource Guide** will connect you to local organizations. Together, we can do a better job to recognize the social isolation, trauma, and pain that inevitably follow from gaps in the system. We can do more to break down barriers to needed services, and more to improve the wellbeing of our shared communities.

Our neighborhood has experienced unacceptable difficulties and has created some of the most amazing accomplishments that humans are capable of. **We have shown that we can change the narrative, that we can rise above systematic racism and create the most beautiful art, culture, spirituality, and entrepreneurship on the planet.**

I have worked eight years in my current role to change the narrative. This Resource Guide will help you connect with the incredible people and institutions we have all around us. Now it is time for me to pass on my duties as Council Member to others. As you read these words, **I feel blessed to know our community is in good hands—yours.**

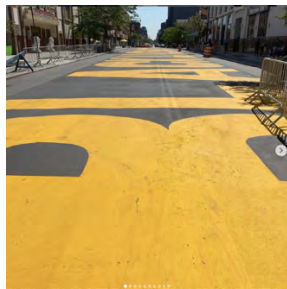

New York City has a special program to protect limited- income seniors from certain kinds of rent increases. Even if you qualify for SCRIE benefits, your rent will not be frozen until you apply. Your landlord cannot refuse to be in the SCRIE program or keep you from being in it.
